Project Description:

Loch Arthur Camphill Community is a working Community which includes men and women with disabilities. There are 80 people in the Community, including families with children, men and women with special needs and local volunteers who join us for periods from a few weeks to several years. Work activities in Loch Arthur include farming (crops, dairy, beef, pigs and sheep), gardening, estate work, creamery, bakery, weaving workshop, woodwork and housework. We also have an award winning Farm Shop and café that is very popular in the area and brings a lot of people from outside to the community.

Work: Volunteers help with any aspects of community life. That includes helping individuals with personal care, preparing meals, with leisure activities, but mainly being part in our workshops. In all work activities the volunteers work in a team including people with learning disabilities. The volunteers live in shared houses, together with long term co-workers and their families, other volunteers and people with special needs.

Requirements: Volunteers have to be 18 years and older.

Food: All meals are provided by the Community. All dietary needs can be

catered for as all meals are prepared freshly within the smaller house communities.

Accommodation: All volunteers have a room to themselves in a shared house. The volunteers take part in all meals within their house community and can make use of all facilities of the house incl. washing machine, internet etc.

Pocket money: 110 GBP per month

Insurance: Volunteers from EU countries: European Health Insurance Card. Non-EU volunteers for over 6 months: Health Surcharge included in visa application. Non-EU volunteers for less than 6 months: must take SCI or private health insurance (see below)

Fees: None

Visa: IVS will help with the visa process if required. Please check your countries requirements for living and working in the UK.

Others: If SCI health insurance is required for the volunteer, the SCI Sending partners that are not in the position to request it should get in touch with IVS.
